Motto “MELIORA”

THE EMBLEM:

Motto: “*Meliora*” is from the latin word “*meliorate*” which means “*to better*”.

In effect, it means to grow better in physique, spirit and intellect.

Concept: The emblem is built around the origin and aspirations of the college that are broken into the base and the head

The base is made of pillars, ending in a stylized “*kecike*” (symbolic beams of a traditional house). The pillars, which are united by this, represent the sponsoring villages which unanimously support and nurture the College. The “*kecike*”, while renders a touch of tradition to the design, bears “ESTD.1982”, above which lays “PFUTSERO GOVERNMENT COLLEGE”. The upper portion of the *kecike* is scooped into a concave to subtend and hold the head.

The head consists of two circles in gold colour, an open book above which is a dove. The book represents knowledge and development; the dove signifies Peace, freedom and liberation

Colors and their meanings:

Green : The colour denotes regeneration, growth, fertility of the mind and continuity

Blue : The colour blue signifies clarity of thought, efficiency and adeptness arising from enlightenment

Gold : The colour gold encompasses all the components of the emblem and thus signifies all the undertakings of the college which are guided and prompted by these ideals. The strong sweeping lines indicate confidence and determination

**COLLEGE RULES AND REGULATIONS:**

1. Classes commence from 9:00 am till 3:15 pm on all week days and working Saturdays. Every student shall attend classes regularly and punctually.
2. 75% attendance is mandatory as per university rules to be eligible for appearing Semester Examinations. Application for leave of absence on medical grounds should be supported by medical certificate.
3. Proxy/ impersonation of attendance are considered a serious offence.
4. Students are to adhere to the College uniform and maintain decorum of cleanliness and modesty while in uniform.
5. Every student must carry his/her Identity Card to the College and produce it when asked for.
6. Use of Mobile phones and any gadgets is prohibited inside the classroom.
7. Cheating and any form of malpractice during examinations will be strictly dealt with.
8. Consumption of drugs, alcohol, tobacco and intoxicants is prohibited within the Campus.
9. Students are not allowed to bring guests/visitors to the class, library or Campus.
10. Riots/ campaigning/ demonstrations by students are banned within the College Campus.
11. Any harassment in any form on fellow students, juniors and especially female students will be treated as punishable offence under the Criminal Act.
12. Any grievances of any kind by the students are to be addressed to the Grievance Redressal Cell of the College.
13. As long as a student is enrolled in the College, he/she shall be held accountable and responsible for his/her actions within and outside the Campus. The Principal will hold authority outside the Campus as well.

THE COLLEGE PROFILE

Pfutsero Government College is one of the acclaimed co-ed institutes of Higher Education in the State offering undergraduate course in Arts. It was established in 1982 under the initiative of a few visionary leaders of the area. The College started with Pre-University level and was initially affiliated to North Eastern Hill University. With the establishment of Nagaland University in 1994, the College was accorded temporary affiliation to the University. The College was officially upgraded to Degree level with pass course by Nagaland University in 2000. From 2004 Honours courses in History, English and Tenyidie was offered and degree examination Centre was accorded to the College the same year. Permission for offering Honours courses in Economics, Pol. Science and Education was officially approved by the Nagaland University in 2014 and subsequent permission to offer pass and Honours course in Sociology was accorded in 2016 to the College. The College celebrated its 25th Anniversary in 2007 and subsequently taken over by the Government of Nagaland on 1st April 2009.

In addition to the course prescribed by the N.U, the College has started add-on and VET courses namely Basic Computer Course and Floriculture in 2013 and 2016 respectively. Over its years of existence the College has continued making efforts to fulfill the vision and mission of the pioneers for the College.

LOCATION

The college is located in the south of Pfutsero Town in the Northeast of India standing at an altitude of 2133 meters above the sea level, which is the highest and coldest township in Nagaland. The College is 70 kms away from the state capital Kohima and 130 kms away from Dimapur Airport. The natural and peaceful setting of the campus offers a calm effect which makes it most conducive atmosphere for intellectual pursuits.





ACADEMICS

The College offers a three- year Undergraduate Course in Arts and follows the curriculum of the Nagaland University. The College adopted the Semester system in 2014 as prescribed by the Nagaland University. The course is divided into 6 semesters (I, II, III, IV, V& VI). The duration of **ODD** semester and **EVEN** semester covers from July to December and January to June.

Eligibility for B. A. 1st Semester

- A minimum of 45% marks in the subject in which the applicant desires to take up Honours.

 - *Seat limit is 150.
 - *1st Semester failed students seeking re-admission in the same class will not be allowed to take up Honours.

LIBRARY

- The College Library is as old as the institution itself. To its collections are study materials that have aided to the student's knowledge needs for over 35 years. In 2009 the college came under the umbrella of the Government of Nagaland and since then, the library has been growing. The college library caters knowledge and services to about 300 students, 40 college staffs and interested research scholars. In the recent years, due to the pressuring demands for quality education across the nation, the library has invested on up-gradation and automation of its services. The library has registered under INFLIBNET Delhi for its IMLS and installed SOUL 2.0 for its automation services. It is semi-automated and attempts will be made to fully atomize in the near future. The library has a collection of 3,200 books and has also initiated subscription of journals, magazines, newspaper, newsletter, e-journals, e-books, e-novels and reports that will help students enrich their learning and research resources.
- The library facilitates basic students' service; student's library card which is issued at the time of admission, and is surrendered along with clearance certificate from the librarian at the time of leaving the college without which a student's caution Deposit cannot be redeemed. Book lending and borrowing of maximum 3 books for Honours students and 2 books for general students for 15 days is allowed per students, failure of which a fine is collected or is blacklisted with a notice and even exposed in the college Notice Board. Books defaced or lost should have to be replaced with another copy of the book or the amount of the books is collected as fine from the defaulter.
- The library timings start from 9:00 am till 3:00 pm and is open for the weekdays and working Saturdays. Photocopying services for students and teachers at a discounted rate is also another feature. In order to encourage library attendance by students and faculty, Best Library user Award was started in 2018.
- The library also started its book club to develop the habit of reading and also initiated Students Library to earn while they learn. In a semi-urban/semi-rural set-up, the college library is thriving to provide its best services to students who come from rural backgrounds and encourage improvement in education by quality services to meet their needs and demands by gradually adopting library standards on par with the rest of the educational institutions across the nation.



**Internal Assessment:**

Students are continually assessed through combined internal exam, class tests, assignments, projects, seminars and fieldtrips. Out of the total marks in the Semester Exam 30% weightage is assigned to internal marks.

Attendance:

A minimum of 75% attendance is required for a student to be eligible to sit for the semester exam.

Remedial/ Tutorial Class:

The college provides remedial classes for each semester every working day after class hours which is looked after by the respective departments based on the syllabus structure and students comprehension on the concerned subject. Special attention is given especially to academically weak students to improve their performance on par with their peers.

Mentoring:

To ensure quality education and to address the emotional and mental challenges that hamper students' academic performance each faculty is assigned with 6 to 7 mentees every academic year giving opportunities to students to interact with their mentors on a one-to-one basis. This helps the college through the mentors to keep an update on the student's attendance as well as in their overall progress. The whole mentoring process is looked after by the mentoring committee.





ADD-ON COURSES

Floriculture:

The College started Floriculture as an Add- on course in 2017 with RUSA, MHRD as the funding unit. The course is for a duration of 1(one) year and offered to the 5th and 6th Semester students. There are 4 (four) poly houses; 2 (two) in the present campus and 2 (two) in the new campus. A demonstration cum office block and a gardener quarter is constructed in the new campus. The course syllabus is adopted from the Kohima Science College Floriculture Skill Enhancement Course- (BOS 3.11). Theoretical classes are taken up every Wednesday. In the art of nurturing plants practical classes is followed through every Friday. Two teachers attended a one day training program on Floriculture under Mission for Integrated Development for Horticulture (MIDH) in 2017.

Basic Computer Course:

The Computer Education Committee consisting of two teaching faculty was set up in 2012 with the aim to impart basic knowledge on computer and its applications to the students. The course is for a duration of 3 months and is open to all the students. Students are assessed through written and practical exams at the end of the course. Courses offered

In addition to satisfying one's hunger and thirst, a lot of serious discussions also happen in the canteen on topics of current interest.

PFUTSERO GOVERNMENT COLLEGE TEACHERS ASSOCIATION (PGCTA)

PGCTA was formed in the year 2009. The Association works within the framework provided by the All Nagaland Government College Teachers Association (ANGCTA). The PGCTA is affiliated to the All India Federation of University and College Teachers Organisation (AIFUCTO).

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS)

National Service Scheme is a voluntary Scheme of students under the Ministry of Human Resources, Department of Youth Affairs and Sports Government of India to inculcate social consciousness and a sense of responsibility and discipline through community service. The scheme works under the motto, "Not me but you".

 - c. To have a concern for the well-being of the community, particularly of the weaker sections.

 - f. To gain skills in the exercise of democratic leadership.
 - g. To gain skills in the programme of development for self- involvement during leisure and vacation period.

NSS badge and NSS certificate recommend volunteers in good stead in their future career. The college joined the NSS in 2007, 1 unit (100 volunteers) are being recruited every year to visit and interact with other counterpart of the country, at present the unit is doing a two-fold program: regular activities and social camping. The unit is headed by a Nodal Officer.

EVANGELICAL UNION (EU)

The college Evangelical Union was formed as an independent body on 10th October 2010 which was concredited by Rev. Dr. N. Chiero. Membership is voluntary and is open to everyone. Initiated and supported by SACS-State Aids Control Society, the programme addresses the knowledge, attitude and behavior of the youths and serves as a complementary and comprehensive promotional, and preventive intervention to enhance Voluntary Blood Donation as well as mainstream HIV and AIDS prevention, care and support and treatment impact, mitigation and stigma reduction while also preparing and promoting youth peer education within and outside the campuses.

In order to have a cordial relation with the students and create an interest in the subject the Department of History started the 'History Club' in 2017. The teaching faculty of the department and honours students are its members and others can become members voluntarily. The 'History Club' is headed by the HOD of History, which will be gradually handed over to the students as they grow in number. The department also offers mentorship to the honours students exclusively by the Asst. Professors of the department.

ANTI-SEXUAL HARASSMENT COMMITTEE

Sexual Harassment is considered as a malice that needs to be dealt with promptness and severity at all levels. In order to take a concerted effort and appropriate steps to put in place a mechanism to prohibit, prevent and to address any form and degree of sexual harassment, the college set up an anti-sexual harassment cell. The cell is headed by a convenor and three members.

Aims and Objectives:

1. To sensitize the campus community on gender issues.
2. To create an environment free from harassment, violence, exploitation and intimidation.
3. Seeks to prevent discrimination against women by promoting gender amity/cordiality among students and employees.
4. To provide a healthy and friendly atmosphere to students, teachers and non-teaching faculty of the college.
5. To take action when complaints of discrimination and harassment are lodged by the victims or third party address to the committee.
6. To ensure equal access of all facilities and participation in activities of the college.
7. To promote social and psychological environment that will raise awareness about sexual harassment in its various forms.

NEEDY STUDENTS' WELFARE FUND

Since the college is geographically based in the rural areas and keeping in view of the past experiences where many students come to study and avail formal education from the economically weaker background, The Needy Students' Welfare Fund was started in 2018 and is sponsored with the willing contributions from the teaching faculty members and the staff of the college. The committee is headed by the Principal as chairman and five other members. The selection of the beneficiary(s) is done after reviewing the overall authenticity and genuineness of the particular candidate. One (1) beneficiary is selected from each semester class. This is to ensure that at least three (3) beneficiaries are made to avail the benefit on a continuous basis under this Fund. However, if any genuine candidate is not identified in a particular semester, two candidates may be even selected from another semester. The total grant for each beneficiary will cover the total basic fees realized by the college from other students. This grant will cover all the other components of fees except that of the uniform and other abnormal fees. In the event of any disqualification/discontinuation, a new beneficiary will be selected.
